Target

Description

The course aims to develop the critical understanding of the meaning of rational argumentation and of philosophical discussion, starting from the analysis of the history of the idea of “toleration” understood as a precondition for democracy and civil society.

Main contents

The course will be dedicated to the analysis of the philosophical discussions on the idea of “toleration” as the starting point to understand the necessary preconditions for public discussions and rational agreements in contemporary civil society. Indeed, the tolerance is an indispensable political virtue in liberal democracies. Without it, pluralistic societies like our own would be unable to deescalate internal conflicts across political, religious, cultural, and ethnic dividing lines. However, our strong belief in the need for the practice of tolerance is not matched by a corresponding theoretical certainty. Despite the widespread discussions of the idea since its emergence in the early modern period, tolerance has remained a notoriously elusive concept. In this course, we will trace various historical and intellectual paths that have led to our current understanding and practice of tolerance. Starting from Aristotle’s *Ethics*, the New Testament, and St. Augustine’s *City of God*, we will carefully study the arguments by the classic advocates for tolerance (such as Spinoza, Pierre Bayle, John Locke, and Voltaire) up to the contemporary age (Wendy Brown).
